

Ms. Carole Ramsay is the author of *Protecting Investment, Profit, and Personnel* and a frequent speaker on the Equator Principles in action. Ms. Ramsay's approach to greater sustainability around mining has created valuable new risk mitigation benefits for investment. This socio-economic based method of strategic and networked sustainability also creates superior return on investment for both the firm and the local stakeholders alike as compared to traditional CSR and reclamation efforts. With graduate-level education in anthropology and conflict, and in political and mineral economics, Ms. Ramsay has worked with the IFC and the UN as well as with private, public, and financial sectors, adding value on projects in Mongolia, East Timor, Ecuador, and Colombia. Having taught on the Yanacocha project as a case example and has recently been asked to do analyses in Bolivia and Chile, a South American focus has come to the fore. Additional valuation work around economic development based means of creating social license, enabling firms and their investors to have more clear access to the necessary information about the minimal amounts involved in mitigating substantial risk, is a key piece of the on-going valuation component to this work.
